2017 AGM - Oregon Youth Soccer Association

Thanks to parents who assist their youth in playing the game.

In this year's report I would like to split comments into several areas, 2015-16 completed year, 2016-17 year we are currently in, and 2017-18 that will begin on July 1, 2017.

Completed Year 2015-16:

These 12 months saw OYSA regain additional member clubs and participants in a growth path toward the 50,000 that we previously had. We were appreciative of these clubs returning and a few new ones who joined us to rebuild into a larger community of youth soccer in Oregon.

This rebuilding experience during the 2015-16 enhanced the competitive program and leagues. It also returned some recreational growth to develop younger players as they progress up the age levels to perhaps participate in the developmental training seasons and then move into the competitive level. Growth and development at the younger ages, still is the path for moving players up through development/training and evidently strengthening the competitive players/ teams for higher levels of competition. There is value added at each level and each type of training.

Year 2016-17:

This year started with a fresh look at the combined community of youth soccer moving into our leagues, and the competitions beyond Oregon for play at Regionals. Some of our clubs grew in participation, as more youth took a look at youth soccer at the younger ages. Innovative coaching and programs in the clubs seek to give every player opportunity to train and develop at a pace in age appropriate events. We will continue to see how well we do at "growing players to grow the sport." [and vice versa].

The Coming Year 2017-18:

As the previous years have rebuilt the Association with clubs and participants, the year 2017-18 will add to that on-going work; the requirement to rebuild the financial stability of the Association. In fact, this will be a major portion of this year's 2017 AGM. The Board of Directors will be presenting a plan to return and re-establish the financial health of the Association over the next few years.

The Association needs to be viewed as a partnership of clubs of all sizes and all varieties of youth soccer participants. Each with their our goals, and yet a common purpose of growing the game by growing players with common values and effort.

We can do this! Let's join together to achieve our best year ever.

If you do not know it, we have a partnership agreement with the Portland Timbers. The Timbers are a valued friend and partner with OYSA. We provide mutual benefits to each other and yet retain our organizational autonomy. They guide and add value to ODP and classic soccer programs, plus identify players who can train and develop through the Timber's Academy. Thanks Timbers!

I would like to brag about your Board of Directors. This is a gifted, engaged group of adults who care about our youth and the game of soccer, and especially about this Association. They have proved to be good thinkers, communicators, and decision-makers to the benefit of our member clubs and participants.

Let me add a word of thanks to the OYSA staff, without whom not much would be accomplished for the Association, they support us in the behind-the-scenes actions all year long. Thanks, Roberta, Brian, Desia, Simon, and David, and around the State our grassroots coordinators, Christian Curiel, John Galas, Aly Hollewijn, and Darren Lilla.

Staff Reports

Operations Director -Roberta Cloutier

Members,

The theme of this year's Annual General meeting is 'Evolve', and as I take a look back at 2016 I am shocked at how much within the association has undergone evolution since this time last year.

2016 started off with the introduction of our Grassroots program. At last year's AGM we introduced our six grassroots coordinators across the state. These qualified, non-club affiliated individuals were able to provide a much more local and rapid-response-type service to our member clubs in those areas. Previously we had done everything from Beaverton and now, having boots on the ground, so to speak we're able to much better service our clubs. As we we refine the program and learned along the way we look forward to what 2017 will bring in the coaching/licensing field.

Another huge change this year was Birth Year Registration. This national-level change affected clubs all over the nation and Oregon was no different. We conducted seminars and training sessions and adapted our registration program to handle the change and a huge note of thanks should go out to all of you registrars across the state as we made the switch. There were, inevitably, some hiccups along the way but now as we ease into what will be the new way of doing things, we feel like we are in a good place as a state.

The Recognize-To-Recover program (often referred to as the 'concussion protocol') was another big, big introduction in 2016. This was absolutely the right thing to do for our players and we got to know that every coach, administrator, and referee involved with Oregon Youth Soccer has had training to help prevent an increase in concussion related incidents. This is a massive step in the right direction.

Another huge change, and arguably one of our most important, was the revamping of our referee training. This had been, for years, an area of concern

for us and we actively took a role in not just training, but retaining referees in the state. We brought David Grbavac on part-time to conduct training seminars and recertification lessons etc as well as really delving into why there is such a massive turn over in our referee membership. He has done an outstanding job being able to get the referees trained, and ready for appropriate levels of soccer. We know we have more to do, and have certainly sought a lot of feedback from our clubs (which you have not been shy about giving!) and we will continue to refine what we're doing this year.

We have also seen big changes internally here at OYSA. We made a change at the top as John Madding stepped down as CEO to concentrate on the Technical Director position full-time and I stepped into the Operations Director position. John resigned from the TD position in December and is no longer with OYSA.

Leading the Oregon Youth Soccer Association is something that I am very passionate about, and since the switch in July, have concentrated on streamlining our protocols and regulations as well as taking a look at our finances and how we can better serve our members long-term. Having that long-term goal is something that every non-profit should have and we are no different. As I get out and around the state and meet you all, I hear similar pieces of feedback about the things we are doing right and, of course, the areas that we need to improve on. I can assure you that we will be continuing to evolve in 2017.

Looking forward into 2017 and with the theme of evolution in our minds, we are going to be focusing exclusively on service this year. With a staff of just four full-time people in the office we have spent the past six months learning how to streamline want we do, how we do it, and how we communicate. Brian, Desia, Simon, and myself are a team that is dedicated to advancing the sport for our members.

You're going to see big changes with our registration software provider, Affinity Sports, in the coming year as they were recently acquired by Dick's Sporting Goods. Desia Bramel heads that department and is extremely excited about some of the new things that she has seen that they are going to be introducing this year. Our member services focus has been taken online and

Brian Scott has spent a considerable amount of time re-creating our administrative side from pen-and-paper to electronic to better serve our members. Simon Date, in marketing, has made big strides in our communication methods with not just Goal Lines Magazine, but with the stream of communication that goes out and a soon-to-be revealed new website which will be more user-friendly and informative.

I would also like to thank our Board of Directors for their guidance over the past year. With all the changes both internal and external that we have experienced it is amazing to look back and see how much we have accomplished.

Lastly, and perhaps most importantly, I would like to thank you, our members. We have thrown a lot of things at you this year. A lot of it obviously was just passing through from the Federation, but you have had to change a lot of things that you've done in order to make things work. We are extremely proud of the way you have rolled with it and are confident that as we evolve in 2017 we know we are in a much better place than we were last year.

Member Services -Brian Scott

Member Services is dedicated to identifying and responding to the needs of clubs and their members. For most clubs this involves referee and player development opportunities, inter and intra club grievance resolution and assisting with issues such as club legal challenges, bylaw and/or policy revisions, and risk management. In addition to serving member clubs, the department has been involved in the operation of sponsored leagues and tournaments. Member Services is also responsible for assisting the OYSA Vice President to manage OYSA disciplinary hearings as well as supporting and expanding TOPSoccer programs in member clubs and the Soccer Across America program.

Maintaining frequent contact with our member clubs is an essential activity of Member Services so OYSA can be aware of and respond to the changing business and programmatic landscape that confronts our clubs throughout our state. Last year we aided in establishing new clubs, assisted several groups to understand the process of establishing a club, assisted existing clubs with bylaw reviews and other governance issues and assisted in resolving a number of disputes and grievances.

The Member Services Department has made available on our website documents to assist new clubs as well as existing clubs with bylaws, policies, and risk management. The department will continue to develop manuals to supplement policies for discipline and membership. The goals for manual development are to streamline procedures and make guidance more easily accessible to our members.

Soccer Across America

Soccer Across America has a goal to bring soccer to all children regardless of where they live. The program is dedicated to creating new soccer clubs and providing playing opportunities to children in under served and un-served soccer areas throughout the state. US Youth Soccer has suspended grants due to their budgetary constraints. While OYSA has continued to assist new club development, we have been unable to provide direct financial support to new clubs.

During FY 12-13 OYSA worked with our predominately Spanish speaking clubs to begin the creation of an umbrella service program under the name of Alianza. OYSA continued to work with those programs during FY 13-14 and FY 14-15 as the Alianza clubs transitioned to holding their meetings without the direct participation of OYSA. During FY 15-16 the Alianza operated independently. OYSA continues to support individual clubs in meeting the requirements to be either member clubs or affiliates of OYSA.

LEAGUES AND TOURNAMENTS

During the 2015-2016 fiscal year Oregon Youth Soccer continued to build on its partnership with the Portland Timbers and Thorns to operate leagues and tournaments for all levels of competition. In the fall of 2015 the Portland Timbers and Thorns consolidated its leagues into a single structure. The consolidated league offered play from U11 through U18 for boys and U11 through U14 for girls. The league offered multiple divisions in each age group to give teams the opportunity to play similar teams. OYSA also partnered with the Timbers and Thorns to provide a developmental league for U8, U9, and U10 teams.

During 2015-2016 OYSA organized and administered:

- · Sanctioning of member club leagues and tournaments
- Out-of-State and international team travel approval
- · All player, coach and administrator registration
- Team eligibility for the US Youth Soccer National Championship Series and the US Youth Soccer

- Regional and National Presidents Cup
- Leagues and tournaments in cooperation with the Portland Timbers.

RESULTS in EVENTS Managed with the Portland Timbers and Thorns

RECREATIONAL

Portland Timbers/OYSA U8-U10 Developmental League

The OYSA/Timbers Developmental League is a league for U8 through U10 teams in the Portland Metro area who are looking for additional competition to develop individual skills within a team environment. All games are played on Sundays at Delta Park. Games are played in a 7v7 format on the synthetic turf fields with properly sized fields and goals. The league offers flexible rostering that allows clubs to move players between their teams in the same age group as player development dictates. All players are classified as recreational and the league does not publish results or standings. Modified rules promote building up play from the back and keeping the ball on the ground.

The fall 2015 developmental league had 135 teams participate, an 82% increase over the 74 teams in fall 2014. There were 155 teams playing in spring 2016, a 76% increase from the 88 teams participating in the 2015 spring developmental league. OYSA expects continued strong interest in competitions for U9 and U10 as the Federation has finalized rules of play in these age groups.

COMPETITIVE

Fall – 2015 Leagues

The Timbers and Thorns presented their first fall season with OYSA in 2014. The fall 2014 leagues provided play for a total of 284 teams across all age groups and divisions. The fall 2015 leagues increased significantly to 505 teams in all age groups combined. OYSA staff and the other partners working with the Timbers were able to handle the increased workload caused by this near 78% increase in participation without significant problems. The increased number of teams allowed for a better competitive balance among the teams.

2015 Founders Cup

The tournament was targeted at U11-U14 teams playing Division 2 of the fall leagues and any recreational teams that wanted to challenge themselves against competitive teams. 15-16 Oregon Presidents Cup – Presented by the Timbers (boys) and Thorns (girls)

The Presidents Cup is the state level of the US Youth Soccer Presidents Cup tournament intended for non-premier, competitive level U11-U18 teams. The 15-16 Oregon Presidents Cup presented by the Timbers (boys) and Thorns (girls) tournament began in November 2015 with play for U11-U14 teams. The U11 and U12 teams played to finals and the U13 and U14 teams played to determine the semifinalists. U15-U18 teams began their participation in the tournament in April 2016. The Oregon Presidents Cup completed play in April and May concurrently with the Oregon State Cup. A total of 223 teams participated in the Oregon Presidents Cup during the 15-16 year.

The Oregon Presidents Cup is an open tournament for any age-eligible teams that are 100% registered with OYSA prior to the beginning of the tournament. Finals for U13-U18 were played May 1st at Buckman Field Park in Portland and the Tualatin Hills Rec Center in Beaverton. The Champions of the

U13 - U17 age groups were eligible to advance to the Region IV Presidents Cup Tournament, which was held in Arvada, Colorado, June 14-19, 2016.

Oregon State Cup – 2016 – Presented by the Timbers (boys) and Thorns (girls)

The Oregon State Cup Presented by the Timbers (boys) and Thorns (girls) is the state level of competition in the US Youth Soccer National Championship Series. Games were played in April and May with the finals on May 7, 2016.

The US Youth Soccer National Championship Series is the country's most prestigious national youth soccer tournament, providing approximately 185,000 players on over 10,000 teams from US Youth Soccer State Associations the opportunity to showcase their soccer skills against the best competition in the nation while emphasizing teamwork, discipline and fair play.

The US Youth Soccer National Championships cap a year long series of competitions for boys and girls teams in multiple age brackets as teams earn their way from the top teams in their state to the regional championship tournaments. US Youth Soccer State Champions and selected wildcard teams from US Youth Soccer Regional Leagues in most age groups are eligible to compete in one of four US Youth Soccer Regional Championships. The champions in the U13 through U19 age brackets from each of the four regional events plus four teams from the US Youth Soccer National League in the U14-U18 age groups converge in July for the US Youth Soccer National Championships.

The US Youth Soccer National Championship Series annually provides the nation's top collegiate coaches with the premier stage to identify and scout the most coveted players in the country.

It's also visually more stimulating, which can be a benefit when we look at partnerships, and adding social media aspects to it.

We had, historically, sent out hundreds of emails a year to various groups, and on elf the challenges I was tasked with was to eliminate the qty, and replace it with quality in terms of communication. While we will always have peak times and months that are busier than others, we certainly recognize that we can do a better job at consolidating what we share with you.

This coming year you will see more personalization of stories. We want to tell your stories. Share your successes and to some extent, share the issues, too, because with everyone pulling together we can ensure that we grow together.



Budget Summary

Secretary/Treasurer Report Fiscal Year 2015-2016, Year in Review

The accounting firm of Gary McGee & Co. performed a financial review of the Oregon Youth Soccer Association's financial records as of June 30, 2016. The review includes primarily applying analytical procedures to management's financial data and making inquiries of organization management. The financial statements reflect the consolidated results of Oregon Youth Soccer Association (OYSA) and Oregon Youth Soccer Foundation (OYSF). The preliminary report dated January 4, 2017 finds "Based on our review, we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying consolidated financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States."

The financial statements reflect the consolidated results of Oregon Youth Soccer Association (OYSA) and Oregon Youth Soccer Foundation (OYSF). For the year ending June 30, 2016, our net assets decreased by \$192,734. Our 2016-2017 Budget was prepared with a projected operating profit of \$92,690.

OYSA prepares a profit and loss statement, balance sheet and bank reconciliation each month, which are regularly reviewed by the Finance Committee. The Finance Committee then reports significant results to the Oregon Youth Soccer Association's Board of Directors. Further, a quarterly report is prepared for the Finance Committee, detailing budgetary variances.

The Finance Committee meets as needed to review and approve the annual budget, review financial records and assess fiduciary responsibility. The committee reviews financial reports and develops clear and concise reporting strategies for the board and Oregon Youth Soccer Association records.
