The Son of a Coast Guard Quartermaster, Ryan spent most of his youth moving up and down the West Coast and living in coastal towns like Astoria, Coos Bay, Valdez and Petaluma. Ultimately, though, Ryan was born in Bend, Oregon and still considers that his hometown. Ryan graduated from the University of Evansville in 2003, where he played 4 years with the Purple Aces while completing his Bachelor of Science in Mass Communication. During his summers, Ryan played in the USL Premier Development League for the Cocoa Beach Expos in Florida.

After college, Ryan signed for the Portland Timbers, which brought him back to the West Coast. After playing for the Timbers, along with a season in Salt Lake City, he focused his time on his coaching development. He decided to return to the Timbers PDL team in 2009 (their inaugural season) and went on to score 11 goals in 14 appearances, ultimately being selected to the All-Conference Team. Ryan has been in Portland for 15 years now, making this the longest duration he's ever lived in one city. His coaching career includes time at Beaverton High School from 2006 to 2013, where he took a losing program and guided them in becoming league contenders and eventually State Finalists in 2010. Ryan was the Oregon Coerver Coaching Associate Director for 3 years and served as an OYSA Coaching Mentor for the USSF Coaching Education Program. In 2006, Ryan took the Boys Director of Coaching position at BSC Oregon. In 2009, he moved into the Technical Director position, where he remained until 2013. Ryan then served as the BSC Oregon Director of Operations, eventually moving into the Executive Director position prior to helping facilitate the merger between BSC Oregon and Northeast United.
